- 1. Kathleen Henley reported the Treasury has a balance of \$854.42 after a generous donation by new members.

- 7. More discussion was held on the Get Acquainted hikes. One will be held on September 6 (Labor Day) at Three Creeks near Columbia. Those participating will leave at 9:00 am. from the east commuter lot in North JC. Bring a lunch. The October Get Acquainted hike will be on October 17 on the woods trail near Riverside Park. Meet at the Lewis and Clark Office Building at 11 am.
- 8. A volunteer committee has been preparing for a booth at the MU Extension Fall Festival on Sept. 11 for a fundraiser. The next work session will be at Celeste's house, 1017 Holly, on August 17 at 6:15 pm.
- 9. A renewal of the ½ cent city sales tax passed by a good margin. It will provide funding for greenways and parks improvements as well as other things.
